Stephanie Lüning is an artist from Germany. Her main focus lies on ephemeral, process based art in public spaces and on interactive based art.


With these different methods and attempts she tries to play with the generic limits of "painting" and its "open-ended" results.





About 'Island of Foam







She then processes the water through a large foam-making machine.

The foam is then released, with colours layering one on another.

The primary colours are also mixed to create other colours, or shades.
